To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, an Order from the Secretary of the Interior, accompanied by a Schedule of Allotments of land for certain Indians of the La Pointe, or Bad River Reservation, as contemplated by the Treaty concluded September 30, 1854, with the Chippewa Indians of Lake Superior and the Mississippi, and subsequent legislation, including the Act of Congress approved August 1. 1914, whereby it appears that George A. Cloud has been allotted the east half of the west half of the southeast quarter and the east half of the west half of the west half of the southeast quarter of Section thirty-three in Township forty-seven north of Range three west of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Wisconsin, containing sixty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor-General:

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the Treaty and Act of Congress aforesaid, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DOES GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said George A. Cloud, and to his heirs, the tract above described; but with the stipulation that the said George A. Cloud or his heirs, shall not sell, lease, or in any manner alienate said tract without the consent of the President of the United States; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said George A. Cloud, and to his heirs and assigns, forever, with the stipulation as aforesaid.
