WHEREAS George E. Walker and Alexander Robinson, Assignees

whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said

the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for

the South fraction of the South East quarter of Section twenty-four, in
Township thirty-six, North, of Range fourteen, East, in the District of Land,
subject to sale at Chicago, Illinois, containing One hundred and
forty-six acres and ninety-seven hundredths of an acre,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the **SURVEYOR
GENERAL**, which said tract has been purchased by the said Henry Cloud and Elind Berry,

AND KNOW YE

NOW KNOW YE, That the

United States of America, in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in
such case made and provided, **HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED,** and by these presents **DO GIVE AND GRANT,** unto
the said George E. Walker and Alexander Robinson,

and to their heirs, the said tract above described: **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, together with all the rights,
privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said George E. Walker
and Alexander Robinson,

and to their heirs and assigns forever,

as tenants in common and not as joint tenants.
