To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States an Order of the Secretary of the Interior directing that a fee simple patent issue to **RICHARD CLOUD,** a Sisseton and Wahpeton Indian, for the east half of the southeast quarter and the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of Section twenty-seven and the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Section twenty-six in Township one hundred twenty-five north of Range fifty-one west of the Fifth Principal Meridian, South Dakota, containing one hundred sixty acres,

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DOES GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Richard Cloud, and to his heirs, the lands above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said Richard Cloud, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I, **Theodore Roosevelt**, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
