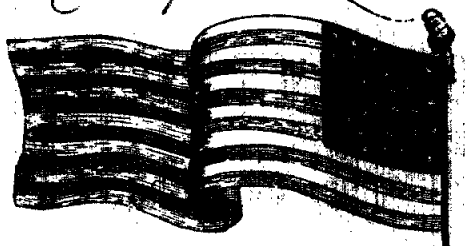

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE,

Warrant No. 79,915 for 120 acres, in favor of John Cloyd Private Captain Robertson's Company, Tennessee Militia, Creek War,

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the last half of the South East quarter, and the North West quarter of the South East quarter of Section thirty-five in Township twenty-five North of Range Six East, in the District of lands subject to select Stevens Point, Wisconsin, containing one hundred and twenty acres,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL the said Warrant having been assigned by the said John Cloyd to James V. Casley, in whose favor said tract has been located,

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

James V. Casley, as assignee as aforesaid, and to his heirs

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said

James V. Casley, as assignee as aforesaid, and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
