To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 56438 for 40 acres, issued in favor of Christopher Seebold, Private, Captain Donaldson's Company, Pennsylvania Militia. War 1812

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the South West fractional quarter of the North West quarter, of Section seven, in Township eighty eight North, of Range thirteen West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Dubuque, Iowa, containing Fifty three Acres and eighty nine hundredths of an acre.

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Robert A. Jones

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Robert A. Jones, and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
