**WHEREAS**, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE,

Warrant No. 41,807 for 160 acres in favor of Catharine Bilger  
widow of John Bilger, Ensign, Captain Lous's Company,  
Pennsylvania Militia, War 1812

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon

the south west quarter of  
Section four, in Township seventy-four, north of Range thirty-  
five, west, in the District of Lands subject to sale at  
Council Bluffs, Iowa, containing one hundred and  
sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by  
the SURVEYOR GENERAL

the said warrant having been assigned  
by the said Catharine Bilger to Henry Sebald, in whose  
favor the said tract has been located

**NOW KNOW YE**, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

Henry Sebald as assignee as aforesaid and to his  
heirs

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances

thereof, unto the said Henry Sebald as assignee as aforesaid  
and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
