THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

KNOW YE, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847,

Montz Seibel, private in Captain Fisher's company Battalion Missouri Light Artillery,

having deposited in the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** a **WARRANT** in *his* favor, numbered *43,481*:

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto *Hugh Richards,* assignee of said *Montz Seibel,* and to his heirs, the West half of the South West quarter of Section twenty-eight, and the East half of the South East quarter of Section twenty-nine, in Township seventy-five North, of Range nineteen West, in the District of lands subject to sale at Fairfield, Iowa, containing one hundred and sixty acres,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** by the **SURVEYOR GENERAL,** which said tracts have been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the said *parts of said* sections of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Hugh Richards, and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.

PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the **SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE** to be hereunto affixed.
