Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 9778 for 160 acres, issued in favor of *John J. Sibels Lieutenant Colonel in First Battalion Alabama Volunteers American War*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the

North west quarter of Section Twenty nine in Township Twelve of Range Six in the District of Lands subject to sale at Cahaba Alabama containing One hundred and fifty nine acres and ~~Forty~~ ^{Sixty} ~~two~~ hundredths of an acre.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *which has been assigned unto Franklin H. Peck.*

Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Franklin H. Peck*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Franklin H. Peck*

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, *Franklin Pierce* PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
