To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. *64,214* for *40* acres, issued in favor of *Elizabeth Seybold, widow of Dempsey Seybold Private in Captain Mitchell's Company, Kentucky Militia* *War 1812*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *South west quarter of the South west quarter of Section Three in Township Fifteen North of Range Ten East in the District of Lands Subject to Sale at Palestine Illinois containing Forty Acres*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL; *which has been assigned unto Charles Welliver*

Now know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Charles Welliver*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Charles Welliver and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, *Franklin Pierce* PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
