Whereas *Otthon Seybold*

has deposited in the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the

Land Office at *Parrington*

whereby it appears that full payment has been

made by the said *Otthon Seybold*,

according to the provisions of

the act of Congress of the 2^d July 1836, entitled, "An Act for Paying off the Towns of

Fort Madison and Parrington in the County of Des Moines and the Town of

Bellevue, Du Pique, and Peru in the County of Du Pique, and Mineral

Point in the County of Iowa, Territory of Wisconsin, and for other purposes,"

and also of the act amendatory of the same approved 3^d March 1837

for Town Lot numbered six hundred and seventy five, of the second class,

in the Town of *Fort Madison*, in the now Territory of Iowa, containing sixteen

hundredths of an acre,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said town, returned to the General Land Office, which said town

lot has been purchased by the said *Otthon Seybold*,

NOW KNOW YE That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**,

in consideration of the Premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and

provided, **HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED**, and by these presents **DO GIVE AND GRANT**, unto the said

Otthon Seybold

and to his heirs, the said town lot

above described: **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and

appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said *Otthon Seybold*,

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
