Whereas, There has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a CERTIFICATE of the Register of the Land Office at Jackson, Mississippi

whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "to secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto,

the claim of Jane Whittington widow of Hiram Whittington has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the South half of the North East Quarter of Section thirteen in Township ten North of Range eight East of Choctaw Meridian in Mississippi containing seventy-seven acres and ninety-three hundredths of an acre.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL:

Now know ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Jane Whittington

the tract of Land above described, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Jane Whittington and to her heirs and assigns forever.
