To all to whom these presents shall come, GREETING:

Whereas, There has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the UNITED STATES, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Osawkee, Kansas Territory whereby it appears that full payment has been made by Ambrose Jones of Calhoun County, Kansas Territory according to the provisions of the Treaty with the Delaware Tribe of Indians, concluded on the sixth day of May 1854, for a Tract of Land designated on the Official Plat of Survey as the North West fractional quarter of Section nineteen, in Township seven of Range sixteen, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Osawkee, Kansas Territory, containing one hundred and fifty nine acres and fifty seven hundredths of an acre; and the said tract having been duly assigned by the said Ambrose Jones to John W. Claud and Henry C. Hampton of Surry County, North Carolina

Now know ye, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and pursuant to the provisions of the treaty aforesaid, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents to GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said John W. Claud and Henry C. Hampton as assignees and to their heirs, the said Tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said John W. Claud and Henry C. Hampton, as assignees and to their heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, James Buchanan President of the United States, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
