To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE,

Warrant No. 71,341 for 120 acres, in favor of David Canaday Private, Captain Harlow's Company, Indiana Militia War 1812

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the West half of the North East quarter and the North East quarter of the North West quarter of Section Twenty eight, in Township Thirty eight of Range Twenty four in the District of Lands, subject to sale at Warsaw Missouri, containing one hundred and Twenty acres

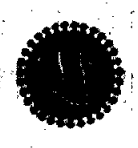
according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL the said warrant having been assigned by the said David Canaday to Henry B. Clements and by him to E. C. John Claude in whose favor the said tract has been located

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said E. C. John Claude as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said E. C. John Claude as assignee as aforesaid and to his

heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Abraham Lincoln PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
