TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

**KNOW YE,** That Baylis Cloud, of Kentucky,

having deposited in the General Land-Office a certificate of the Register of the Land-office at Cincinnati, whereby it appears that full payment has been made for the North East quarter of Section twenty-eight, of Township seven, in Range one, (West of the Meridian line)

of the lands directed to be sold at Cincinnati, by the act of Congress, entitled "An act providing for the sale of the lands of the United States in the territory north-west of the Ohio, and above the mouth of Kentucky river;" and of the acts amendatory of the same, There is granted, by the United States, unto the said Baylis Cloud, the quarter, — lot or section of land above described: To have and to hold the said quarter, — lot or section of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said Baylis Cloud, his — heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land-Office to be hereunto affixed.
