To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, Benjamin F. Cloud of Stanton County Kansas

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Garden City, Kansas, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Benjamin F. Cloud

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for

the lots numbered three and four and the east half of the south west quarter of section seven in township twenty eight South of range forty two West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Kansas, containing one hundred and fifty five acres and forty seven hundredths of an acre

according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Benjamin F. Cloud

Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Benjamin F. Cloud

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said

Benjamin F. Cloud

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
