To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, an Order of the Secretary of the Interior has been deposited in the General Land Office, directing that a fee simple patent issue to Henry Poweke, Ellen Poweke, and Benjamin H. Cloud, heirs of Timse, a New Perce Indian, for the south half of the north half of the Lot eleven, the south half of the north half of the Lot twelve, and the south half of the south half of the lot thirteen of Section two in Township thirty-five north north half of the Lot thirteen of Section two in Township thirty-five north of Range four west of the Boise Meridian, Idaho, excepting from the effect of this conveyance, however, that certain parcel of ground containing three and twenty-hundredths acres heretofore conveyed to A. L. McKee, by deed approved March 23, 1913, by the Secretary of the Interior and recorded in the Indian Office Deed Book, Inherited Indian Lands, volume 29, page 238, in the Office of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, containing, after making the exception above specified, eleven and eighty-hundredths acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor-General: GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor-General:

NOW KNOW YZ, that the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents POES GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said heirs and to their heirs, the land above described; TO HOVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said heirs and to their heirs and assigns forever, in accordance with the said heirs and to their heirs and assigns forever, in accordance with the terms of said order, to wit: to Henry Poweke, an undivided one-third interest; and to Benjamin H. Cloud, an undivided one-third interest. and there is reserved from the lands cloud, an undivided one-third interest. and there is reserved from the lands thereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States. The land covered by his patent is not liable for any debt contracted prior to this date, as provided by Section 5 of the Act of February 8, 1887(24 Stat., 388, 389), and the amendatory Acts of May 8, 1906(34 Stat., 182), and June 21, 1906(34 Stat., 325, 327).
