To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

THERMAS, an Order of the Secretary of the Interior has been deposited in the General Land Office, directing that a fee simple patent issue to Henry Poweke, Ellen Poweke and Benjamin H. Cloud, heirs of Timse, a Nez Perce Indian, for the following described tract: Beginning at a point ten chains south of the northwest corner of Lot eleven of Section two in Township thirty-five north of Hange four west of the Boise Meridian; thence north one and fifty-hundredths chains, thence west five chains, thence south three chains, thence east five chains, thence north one and fifty-hundredths chains to the place of beginning, being part of Lot ten of said Section two in Township thirty-five north of Range four west of the Boise Meridian, Idaho, containing one and fifty-hundredths acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

NOT KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DORS GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said heirs and to their heirs the Land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said heirs and to their heirs and assigns forever, in accordance with the terms of said order, to wit: to Henry Poweke, an undivided one-third interest: to Ellen Poweke, an undivided one-third interest and to Benjamin H. Cloud, an undivided one-third interest. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States. The land covered by this patent is not liable for any debt contracted prior to this date, as provided by Section 5 of the Act of February 8, 1887 (24 Stat., 385, 389), and the amendatory Acts of May 8, 1306 (34 Stat., 182), and June 21, 1906 (34 Stat., 325, 327).
