WHIRMAS, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, an Order from the Secretary of the Interior, accompanied by a Schedule of Allotments of land for certain Indians of the La Pointe, or Bad River Reservation, as contemplated by the Treaty concluded September 30, 1854, with the Chippewa Indians of Lake Superior and the Mississippi, and subsequent legislation, including the Act of Congress approved August 1, 1914, whereby it appears that Dolly I. Cloud has been allotted the north half of the north half of the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter, the east half of the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter, and the east half of the mortheast quarter of the southwest quarter of Section seven in Township forty-six north of Range two west of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Wisconsin, containing fifty-five acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor-General:

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the Treaty and Act of Congress aforesaid, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DOCS GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Dolly I. Cloud, and to her heirs, the tract above described; but with the stipulation that the said Dolly I. Cloud, or her heirs, shall not sell, lease, or in any manner alienate said tract without the consent of the President of the United States; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Dolly I. Cloud, and to her heirs and assigns forever, with the stipulation as aforesaid.
