To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, an Order from the Secretary of the Interior, accompanied by a Schedule of Allotments of land for certain Indians of the Bad River or La Pointe Reservation, as contemplated by the Treaty concluded September 30 1854, with the Chippewa Indians of Lake Superior and the Mississippi, and subsequent legislation, including the Act of Congress approved August 1, 1914 (38 Stat. 583), whereby it appears that Harriet C. Cloud has been allotted the west half of the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section twenty-four in Township forty-eight north of Range three west of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Wisconsin, containing twenty acres. according to the Supplemental Plat approved April 13, 1926:

NOW KNOW IE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the Treaty and Act of Congress aforesaid, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DOES GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Harriet C. Cloud and to her heirs, the tract above described; but with the stipulation that the said Harriet C. Cloud or her heirs, shall not sell, lease, or in any manner alienate said tract without the consent of the President of the United States; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the mights privileges impunities. gether with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said Harriet C. Cloud and to her heirs and assigns forever, with the stipulation as aforesaid.
