Whereas, The heirs of Henry E. Cloud deceased of Sumpter County
Florida

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office
at Gainesville Florida, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said
heirs of Henry E. Cloud deceased

according to the provisions of

the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands,"

and the acts supplemental thereto, for the lots numbered five and six of section
eighteen in township eighteen south of range twentyfour
east of Tallahassee Meridian in Florida containing one
hundred and sixty six acres.

according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General,
which said tract has been purchased by the said heirs of Henry E. Cloud deceased

with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents
DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said heirs of Henry E. Cloud deceased

and to their heirs, the said tract above described: To HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights,
privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said heirs of
Henry E. Cloud deceased
and to their heirs and assigns forever.
