Know Ye, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847. James M. Cloud, late a private in Captain Warfield's Company, Texas Rangers,

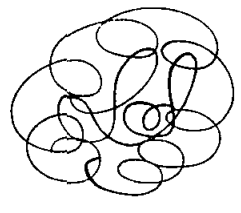
having deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE a WARRANT in his favor, numbered 44.047.

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto John L. Robertson, assignee of said James M. Cloud, and to his heirs, the West half of the South East quarter, and the South half of the South West quarter, of Section eleven, in Township eighty two North, of Range six East, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Iowa City, Iowa, containing one hundred and sixty acres,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said parts of said section of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John L. Robertson, and to his,

heirs and assigns forever.
