

The United States of America,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a schedule of allotments of land, dated March 27, 1911, from the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, approved by the Secretary of the Interior April 3 1911 whereby it appears that, under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved February 8, 1887, (24 Stats., 388,) as amended by the Act of Congress of John Four blond an Indian on the Winnebago reservation, an Indian of the ~~tribe or band~~, has been allotted the following-described land, viz:

The Lots numbered seven, eight and nine and the South East quarter of the North West quarter of Section thirty-five in Township twenty-seven North of Range five East and the Lots numbered two and three of Section eleven in Township twenty-five North of Range seven East of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and fifty eight acres and eighty-seven hundredths of an acre

Lot 2+3 = 22.66 A.

Now, Know Ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and in accordance with the provisions of the fifth section of said Act of Congress of the 8th February, 1887, HEREBY DECLARES that it does and will hold the land thus allotted (subject to all the restrictions and conditions contained in said fifth section) for the period of twenty-five years, in trust for the sole use and benefit of the said John Four blond

or, in case of his decease, for the sole use of his heirs, according to the laws of the State or Territory where such land is located, and that at the expiration of said period the United States will convey the same by patent to said Indian, or his heirs, as aforesaid, in fee, discharged of said trust and free of all charge or incumbrance whatsoever: Provided, That the President of the United States may, in his discretion, extend the said period.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Theodore Roosevelt, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, this eighteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and twenty-sixth
