To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, There has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE OF THE UNITED STATES an ORDER bearing date January 6, 1902, from the Secretary of the Interior, accompanied by a SCHEDULE with RETURN, dated September 27, 1901, from the Office of Indian Affairs, containing a List of selections of Land for certain Indians of the Bad River Reservation as contemplated by the Treaty concluded September 30, 1854, with the CHIPPEWA INDIANS of Lake Superior and the Mississippi, whereby it appears that on the First day of October 1901 the President, in accordance with the provisions of the 3d Article of said Treaty, approved the selection of Joseph A. Blood, being the South West quarter of the South East quarter of Section Thirty five in Township forty eight north of Range two West and the North East quarter of the North East quarter of Section Thirty three in Township forty six north of Range three West of the Fourth Principal meridian in Wisconsin containing eighty acres according to the OFFICIAL PLAT of the survey of said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now, Know Ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the said Treaty, the ORDER and RETURN, with SCHEDULE aforesaid, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Joseph A. Blood and to his heirs, the said Tract above described; but with the stipulation that said Joseph A. Blood and his heirs shall not sell, lease, or in any manner alienate, said Tract without the consent of the President of the United States; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said Joseph A. Blood and to his heirs forever, provided, as aforesaid, that Joseph A. Blood and his heirs shall not sell, lease, or in any manner alienate, said Tract without the consent of the President of the United States.

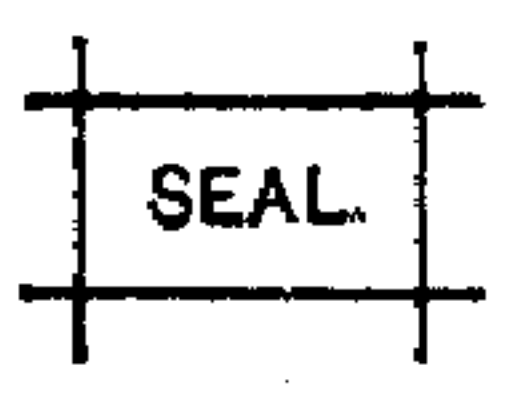
