

# The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, an Order from the Secretary of the Interior, accompanied by a Schedule of allotments of land for certain Indians of the Bad River or La Pointe Reservation, as contemplated by the Treaty concluded September 30, 1854, with the Chippewa Indians of Lake Superior and the Mississippi, and subsequent legislation, including the Act of August 1, 1914 (38 Stat., 582), whereby it appears that Julia A. Cloud has been allotted the Lot eleven of Section two and the Lot fifteen of Section eleven in Township forty-eight north of Range three west of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Wisconsin, containing twenty-two acres and fifty hundredths of an acre, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land on file in the General Land Office:

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the Treaty and Act of Congress aforesaid, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DOES GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Julia A. Cloud, and to her heirs, the tract above described; but with the stipulation that the said Julia A. Cloud, or her heirs, shall not sell, lease, or in any manner alienate the said tract without the consent of the President of the United States; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Julia A. Cloud, and to her heirs and assigns forever, with the stipulation as aforesaid.
