To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WEEREAS, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Salt Lake City, Utah, accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that under the provisions of the Act of Congress of October 2, 1917 (40 Stat. 297) entitled "An Act to authorize exploration for and disposition of potassium," Marshall M. Cloud is entitled to a patent for the south half of Section eleven and the south half of Section twelve in Township two south of Range sixteen west of the Salt Lake Meridian, Utah, containing six hundred forty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Land on file in the General Land Office:

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DOES GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Marshall M. Cloud and to his heirs the land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Marshall M. Cloud and to his heirs and assigns forever, in accordance with the terms and conditions of said Act; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws and decisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.
