CERTIFICATE

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, *Roy P. Cloud of Caddo County, Oklahoma*

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at *El Reno, Oklahoma*, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said *Roy P. Cloud*

according to the provisions

of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for *the South East quarter of Section twenty one in Township eight North of Range eight West of Indian Meridian in Oklahoma, containing one hundred and sixty acres*

according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said *Roy P. Cloud*

Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said *Roy P. Cloud*

and to *his* heirs, the said tract above described: To HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said *Roy P. Cloud* and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.

And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States:
