according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for and the acts supplemental thereto for the North West quarter of the North West quarter of Section thirty and the North East quarter of the South West quarter and the South East quarter of the North West quarter of Section nineteen, in Township six South, of Range two East of Huntsville Meridian in Alabama, containing one hundred and twenty acres and five hundredths of an acre.

according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been purchased by the said William A. Cloud

NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said William A. Cloud

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said William A. Cloud

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
