KNOW YE, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847,

William McCloud, late a corporal in Captain Smith's Company
of the Sixteenth Regiment of United States Infantry

having deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE a WARRANT in his favor, numbered
144,959.

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto Thomas Wilson assignee of
said William McCloud, and to his heirs the West half of the North
West quarter of Section Twenty five, and the East half of the North
East quarter of Section Twenty six, in Township Seventy three North
of Range Seventeen West, in the District of Lands subject to
Sale at Fairfield, Iowa, containing One hundred and
sixty acres.

according to the official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by
the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract shall have been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned War-
rant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HAVE AND
TO HOLD the said parts of said section of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said

Thomas Wilson, and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
