the North West quarter, of the North East quarter, of Section Thirty-five in Township Thirty nine North, of Range one West, in the District of Lands, subject to sale, at St Louis Missouri containing Forty acres

according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been purchased by the said Norman S. Bloudy and Uriah P. Johnson

NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Norman S. Bloudy and Uriah P. Johnson

and to their heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Norman S. Bloudy and Uriah P. Johnson

and to their heirs and assigns forever.
