there and that he served in the militia from
the time he was discharged from Col. Bakers
regiment until the end of the war in 1783
under Col. Clark - Pickens - Turpin and
many other officers but most of the time under
Col. Elijah Clark and that he served at least

six years if not seven years as a private
in the ^{later} ~~war~~ of the revolution and that he was in many skirmishes which are
stated in Lykeil Clouds affidavit more particu-

larly I was to before me A. B. Addison
one of Justices of the Quorum for said district
that the above statement is true to the best

at the first Siege of Augusta under the

skirmish at Shivers ferry on Broad River
and at the Battle of Blackstocks on Tiger
River South Carolina under Col. Elijah
Clark & Gen. Sumpter the whole time which
was in December 1780. and he was under
Col. Elijah Clark when he took Major
Dunlaps on Little River South Carolina
some time in April 1781. and he was in
Capt Nails light horse Company at the
last Siege of Augusta in Georgia
some time in the year of 1781. he was
in an engagement in Wilkes County Georgia
with the Creek Indians some time in
April or May 1782. under the command
of Lieut. George Parson, during all
which time I was with him. the said
Noah Cloud always manifested the greatest
Anxiety for the Cause of freedom
sworn to in open Court before us
on this 1st day of July 1833

On this 11th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight personally appeared before the Court of General Sessions and Common Pleas for the District of Edgelyford His Honor John B. O'Neal presiding, Minny Cloud, a resident of Edgelyford District in the State aforesaid, aged eighty three years, who being duly sworn according to law both on her oath to make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress passed July 4th 1838 entitled "An act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows: That she is the widow of Noah Cloud who was a private soldier in the war of the Revolution; that she has no knowledge of the particular services rendered by the said Noah, nor has she deemed it necessary to make inquiry into those services, since the said Noah was a Pensioner of the United States under the Act of Congress of 1802, on this Deponent's behalf, and to the evidence accompanying his application the Deponent does here to refer for proof to sustain her present application. This Deponent further declares that she possesses no documentary evidence or other evidence to establish by proof the services of the said Noah as a soldier aforesaid, and that her reliance is upon the evidence in the possession of the War Department accompanying the application of the said Noah. She further declares that she was married to the said Noah several years before the close of the war and the expiration of his last term of his service but through decay of memory she is unable to fix the precise date that he resided in Georgia when he first entered the service as this Deponent believes that he departed that State the first day of August 1788 that she knows his death this Deponent believes occurred before the Edgelyford District aforesaid and has since been since deceased and as this Deponent has seen and reviewed and as this Deponent believes to & subscribed the day before last between the 1807 having been first signed in the fourth line from the line commencing with sworn to in the Act of 1838 but dated by water writing before me John B. O'Neal who is a person of credit and the said Deponent Minny is a person of credit and worthy of belief.

Dear Sir:

Reference is made to your request for the record of Noah Cloud, a soldier of the Revolution.

The data furnished below were obtained from papers on file in the pension claim, W. 9389, based upon the military service of Noah Cloud.

He was born in 1752 in Virginia.

He enlisted in 1775 or 1776 and served eight months as private in Captain John Caldwell's Company in Colonel Thompson's South Carolina Regiment. He next enlisted and served nine months as private in Colonel Baker's Georgia Regiment. He then served at various times from about 1780 until the close of the Revolution in 1783 as private in the Georgia Militia under Lieutenant George Barber, Captain Nail and Colonel Elijah Clarke; he was in the first siege of Augusta, in a skirmish on the Broad River, in the battle of Blackstocks, in the last siege of Augusta and in an engagement with the Creek Indians in Wilkes County, Georgia, in April or May, 1782.

He was allowed pension on his application executed November 4, 1832, at which time he was living in Edgefield District, South Carolina.

In 1837 he was referred to as Noah Cloud, Senior, and stated that he had lived in Edgefield District, South Carolina, for the last thirty-three years and before that time he had lived in Virginia, South Carolina and Georgia.

Noah Cloud died August 15, 1838.

He married several years before the close of the Revolution, Unity, her maiden name not given.

She was allowed pension on her application executed October 19, 1838, at which time she was eighty-three years of age and was living in Edgefield District, South Carolina.

In 1833 one Ezekiel Cloud stated that he served during the Revolution with Noah Cloud, relationship not given.

In 1841 reference was made to the large family of Noah and Unity Cloud and it was stated that the eldest, if then living would be between sixty and seventy years of age. There are no further data relative to the soldier's family.
